This poem was written by an anonymous author before he passed away in a hospital in Washington D.C. It was left behind and found in a drawer there.

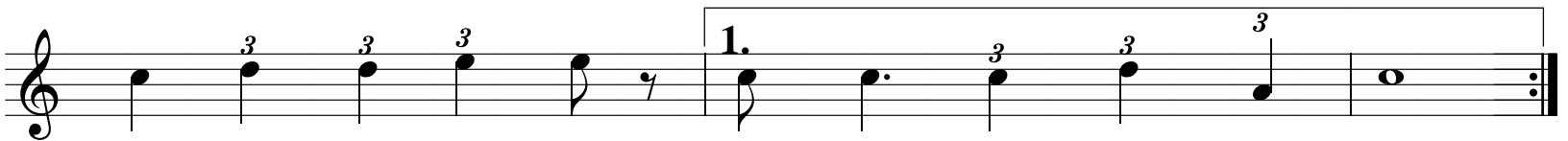

A step on the road to home! When you are lone-ly and sick of

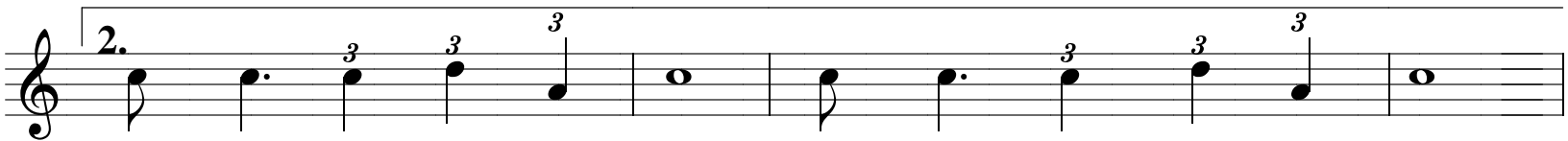

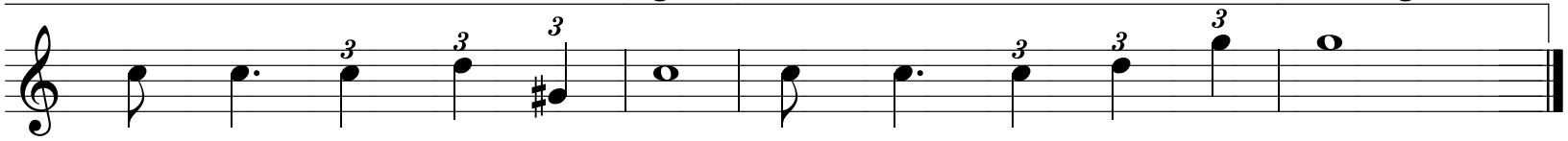
